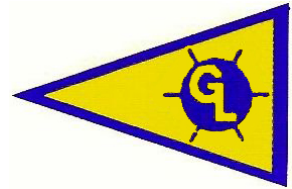

Notice of Race



Announces the 30th 1 + 1 Regatta and 28th Single-Handed Regatta

Great Lakes Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority for this Regatta

Start approximately 11:00am SUNDAY, June 12, 2016

The race is open to all seaworthy mono-hull sailing yachts and will start and finish approx. ½ mile East of the St. Clair Shores Coast Guard Station (see Sailing Instructions for Details).

Management Rules: All races will be governed by the Sailing Instructions and The Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016, including US Sailing Prescriptions, except as stated herein. The races will be managed by the GLYC Race Committee, which will have the authority to establish the racing conditions and interpret the racing rules.

Registration: All entrants must register for the Race. The completed Registration Form including payment of required fees must be received by the GLYC Race Committee no later than the Wednesday before Race Day to complete the registration process. No retroactive scoring of races will occur for non-registered boats. You must register before you race.

Sailing Instructions: Sailing Instructions and Registration Forms can be found on the GLYC website: www.greatlakesyc.com (Check the website periodically for Sailing Instruction changes).

Course: This is an approx. 14.5Nm Point to Point course on Lake St. Clair. The Course details/Class assignments are set forth in the Sailing Instructions.

Race Results, Changes, and Handicapping: Race results will be posted on the GLYC Web Page "Race Results" section A.S.A.P. after the race. Time-on-Time will be used to calculate the results. Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the GLYC bulletin board and website "Race Section". If you do not have a current PHRF rating you may obtain one through the DRYA Web Site www.drya.org. Membership in and handicapping by DRYA is strongly encouraged. More DRYA information is available at www.drya.org.

Scoring: Boats in all classes will be scored according to their corrected times, calculated on a time-on-time basis. The Low Point Scoring System (RRS Appendix A) will apply.

Awards: Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each class.

Support Boats: Support boats shall display a flag marked "RC".

Courtesy Broadcasts: An unofficial designated observer may report all visual signals displayed by the Race Committee over the VHF channel designated for each course. Information so reported is provided as a courtesy to competitors and does not alter the competitors' responsibility to observe the Race Committee's visual signals, which govern the conduct of the racing. Errors or omissions by the observer, or a competitor's failure to hear an observer's report will not be grounds for redress. All boats participating on the A Course are urged to designate a crew person to monitor the Committee channel at all times during the regatta.

Disclaimer of Liability: Competitors participate in these regattas entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. Neither the DRYA nor the sponsoring club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after any of the scheduled regattas.

Classes and Starts: Class splits and start times will be posted and available for downloading on the GLYC website by the Friday before the race. Early registration by participants aids GLYC in determining fair and reasonable class splits.
